Anti-social behaviour covers a wide range of problems including.

Litter and rubbish

Abandoned or burnt out cars

Noisy neighbours and loud parties

Nuisance youths

Vandalism and graffiti

Anti-social use of alcohol and drugs

As a member of the community you can help to stop anti-social behaviour by letting us know it is happening.

Sussex Police as well as Crawley Borough Council, including Neighbourhood Housing Manager and Community wardens, West Sussex County Council and others help tackle anti-social behaviour.

Where possible we will encourage those behaving in an anti-social way to understand the impact their behaviour has on other people and try to discourage it.

Depending on what the problem is, we can tackle it in different ways.

We can:

Ask youth outreach Teams to work with young people hanging around on the streets.

Make physical improvements to the area.

Ask the West Sussex Mediation Service to get involved.

Issue a verbal or written warning.

Agree an Acceptable Behaviour Contract.

If the problems are more serious we can take legal action to obtain:

An Antisocial Behaviour Order.

An Anti-Social Behaviour injunction

A Parenting Order

Action against the tenancy.
