#### PRIORITIES FOR NORTHGATE

Find out about your local priorities here:

##### Priority One

**What you said:** Anti social behaviour, including under age drinking and drug use at Northgate Playing Fields.

**What We Did:** This area has been flagged as a hot spot for our Operation Athlete shifts, an operation dedicated to tackling anti – social behaviour across Crawley. We also ensure there are regular patrols in the area.

##### Priority Two

**What you said:** Anti social behaviour on Northgate Parade including the rear of the shops and garages.

**What We Did:** Again this area is a hot spot for our Operation Athlete shifts, there are regular high visibility patrols in the area and your neighbourhood policing team are liaising closely with the shops to tackle the anti social behaviour in this area.

##### Priority Three

**What you said:** Speeding down Woodfield Road and Barnfield Road.

**What We Did:** Sussex Police are in the process of looking at organising a Community Speed Watch project.
